

B/C's guest lecturers & ball-handling wizards

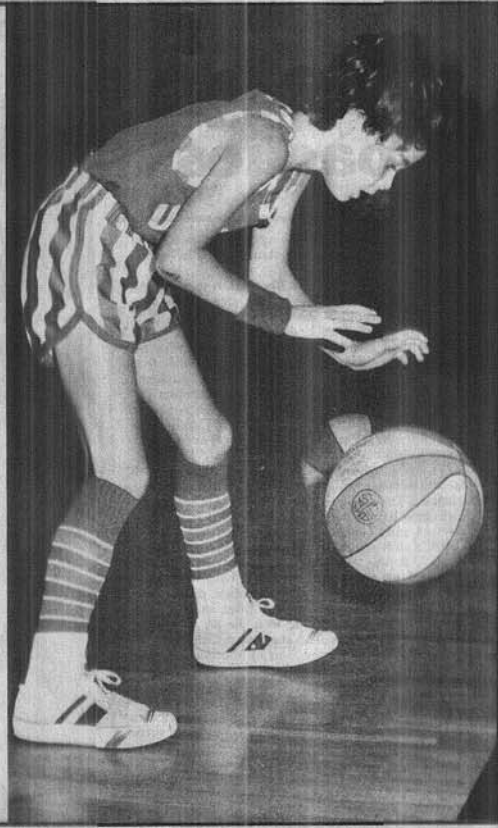
George Schauer

◀ Frank is Assistant Coach of the Atlanta Hawks of the NBA. The 46-year-old Layden, known for his keen sense of humor, compiled an eight-season record of 119-97 as head coach with Niagara University before joining the Hawks — and former college roommate Hubie Brown — in 1976. A 22-7 record in 1970 as well as Niagara's only NCAA tournament appearance that same year highlighted his career. Guard Calvin Murphy, now an NBA star, is a Layden product.
