Certificate Awards will be presented during Friday Morning Roll Call — any Special Awards, as, most Valuable Player will be presented during the All Star Games.

NOTE: - Players are required to check in their reversible Jerseys to their coaches Friday Morning Roll Call.

CHECKOUT PROCEDURES

All campers must check in their room keys and reversible T-shirts in order to receive B/C All Star Camp Shirts and \$5.00 deposit. **Each camper will be held responsible for any damages to the facilities or lost shirts.**

CHECKOUT TIME

You may checkout at 9:00 a.m. provided you are not participating in the Tournament of Champions or an All Star Game. **We are not responsible for any campers following the 4:00 p.m. bus departure to Macon Airport.**

12. Periodically check to see if each coach has the proper allotment of basketballs.
13. Insist that each camper plays at least half the game.
14. Read the league schedule aloud to all campers at roll call.

Choosing Teams (Sunday Evening) To Insure Equality of Teams

1. Coaches, and B/C Camp Directors will be in charge of selecting teams. All questions should be directed toward them.
2. The procedure will be as follows:
 - a. Campers will be divided into First Guards, Second Guards, Centers, First Forwards, Second Forwards.
 - b. Players will be observed in 4-4 games at 3 different basket locations.
 - c. Camp Directors and special appointed coaches will be at basket (1) which is considered the place where the best talent will be finalized.
 - d. Coaches at basket (2) and (3) will be evaluating and ranking players by assigning numbers to each player according to ability.
 - e. Camp Directors will notify basket (2) and (3) when to send the best players to basket (1).
 - f. The number of players to be sent to basket (1) will be called out each evaluation period.

RESPONSIBILITIES

Counselors

1. Keeping time & score of games
2. Participating in counselors' games
3. Wake up call, dorm & cafeteria duty
4. Assisting in fundamental drills
5. **Setting good examples for our campers. Being on time is a requirement.**

Trainers

1. Hiring of trainer staff & replacements if needed
2. Mixing breaktime, Quick-Kick & seeing that each court has a big cooler.

3. Keeping medical records up to date & presenting medical report after completion of camp to Bill Cronauer for filing.
4. Handling insurance procedures at hospital.
5. Ordering supplies & **posting injured list each day.**
6. **Recepting of all purchased items.**

Equipment Manager

1. Ordering equipment.
2. Laundry for campers & staff.
3. Issuing equipment.
4. Checking in equipment.
5. In charge of complimentary cokes & ice.
6. Set up for All-Star Game (chairs, coolers, towels) & making sure special aides carry out assigned duties of cleaning floor before each game.
7. Label all camp property (coolers, etc.)
8. Number each ball & supervise polishing Wednesday & at end of camp.
9. Issuing & taking up balls.
10. Hiring of equipment personnel & replacement if needed.
11. Officials Ice Chest.
12. Camp Store.
13. Concessions.
14. Player Bank.

Coach's Responsibilities

1. All players must play **half** the game. (NO EXCEPTIONS).
2. No **zone** defense is allowed.
3. Substitutions are not to be used as a timeout period. Get players on and off the court quickly.
4. The afternoon and night games will be 40 minutes long, consisting of two 20 minute halves. (Running Clock).
5. No pressing is allowed until the last **two minutes** of second half (except tournament and All-Stars).
6. Each team gets one time-out during the last minute.
7. Don't be critical of the players; remember that is why they came to camp — to learn, not to be overly criticized.

8. Be certain to send your team over to shake hands with the other team after the game.
9. Gather your team together right after the game for a **short talk** relative to their performance.
10. Don't allow one player to do all the shooting.
11. Don't allow your players to argue during the game or criticize each other.
12. Every player must be given a chance to be a starter two times during the week.
13. **The game will be forfeited if a team does not play every player half the game.**
14. Every player must sit out 10 minutes of each half.
15. No player can be excused from a game unless he has a medical excuse from the trainer to miss the game.
16. A Running Clock will be used until the last 1 minute of play. The Clock will be stopped on all violations during the last minute. All fouls during the last period will be a two shot foul.

Coaching Responsibilities For Team Practice

1. Put in team offense (**passing game**) and out of bounds plays.
2. Teach man to man defense (**no zone**).
3. Promote team spirit and team play. 4. Cover bench conduct.
5. Don't have one player doing all the shooting.
6. Optional consideration 1) Man to man press; 2) fast break.
7. Teach players how to line up on jump balls.
8. Teach players how to line up on foul line.
9. This time is to be used for team practice — **not a rest period!**

Voting for the All-Star Team

The Directors will conduct All- balloting at a special meeting Thursday night at 10:30 p.m. Each coach will present a list of 24 players for each All-Star game to BILL CRONAUER. (There are three All-Star games).

Coaches Daily Apparel

Each coach must appear at EVERY session with:

1. T-Shirt and Coaching Shorts. *
2. Whistle.
3. Camp Notebook.
4. Ballpoint pen.
5. Basketball (coaches responsible for equipment).

The Ideal BC All-Star Camp Coach

1. Neat in appearance.
2. **Always on time for all daily activities. ***
3. Enthusiastic.
4. Friendly with a sense of humor.
5. Positive while giving advise.
6. Always a winner.
7. **Willing to make suggestions that can improve the camp.**
8. Will take extra time instructing the campers, when needed.
9. **Does not criticize the camp operation or facilities in front of the campers. Bring complaints to BILL BOLTON.**
10. Does the job with pride in the camp's operation.
11. Never sits down during the league games and drills. *
12. Remembers that the kids are here to learn and not to be criticized, yelled at or belittled in any manner.
